# BEEKMANTOWN CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT RESOLUTION ON PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAX (PILOT) AGREEMENTS

**WHEREAS**, the Beekmantown Central School District's Board of Education ("The Board") is committed to maintaining the fiscal health of the Beekmantown Central School District ("The District") and recognizes excellent fiscal planning as a key factor in attaining the District's educational goals and priorities; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board's budget development shall be carefully organized and planned to ensure thorough understanding of the District's financial needs within the context of the community's fiscal resources; and

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**WHEREAS**, the District has seen a decline in State and Federal Aid over the last several years that has shifted the burden of education funding to the local taxpayer; and

**WHEREAS**, The New York State Gap Elimination Adjustment (GEA) has significantly reduced the total amount of state aid the District has received with a loss of \$ 7.7 million dollars per year since the 2009-2010 school year; and

**WHEREAS**, New York State has implemented an unprecedented number of new unfunded mandates that have placed significant financial pressure on the District; and

**WHEREAS,** in 2011 the New York State Legislature and the Governor enacted "Chapter 97" legislation that establishes a "property tax cap" on the amount that a local government's or school district's property tax levy can increase each year, limiting the District's ability to raise local revenue; and

**WHEREAS**, the Beekmantown Central School District's Board of Education has been forced to make difficult choices to balance the budget with reduced revenue including making programmatic cuts; and

WHEREAS, while new or increased payment-in-lieu-of-tax ("PILOT") agreements may supply some revenue to the Beekmantown Central School District, they also have the negative effect of lowering the District's tax levy limit; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Education Department ("NYSED") provides Tax Cap Guidance on the NYSED website that states that "Districts with increasing or new PILOTs could have a tax levy limit that represents a change from the prior year that is less than zero. They would have to successfully seek an override from the voters to increase the levy above that limit"; and

WHEREAS The Board cannot overlook the adverse financial implications that the District must endure as a result of New York State property tax cap legislation when coupled with PILOT arrangements granted by Industrial Development Agencies ("IDAs"); and

**WHEREAS,** according to information and research the property value increases brought on by investments under tax exempt IDA programs are excluded from the Tax Base Growth Factor ("TBGF"), which partially determines the allowed tax levy increase; and

**WHEREAS,** additionally PILOT arrangements exempt the real property improvements and therefore suppress the TBGF; and

**WHEREAS,** according to said information and research PILOTS create a perpetual harm to the local taxpayer and district, since the TBGF does not get adjusted at the end of the PILOT when the property becomes taxable; and

**BE IT RESOLVED** that the Beekmantown Central School District Board of Education declares its opposition to any PILOT agreements that result in a reduction of real property taxes versus full taxation based on a full market value assessment determined by any and all of the town assessors within the Beekmantown Central School District boundaries; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that that Beekmantown Central School District Board of Education calls on the Development Corporation and Industrial Development Agency to recognize the District's position that PILOT agreements have an adverse impact on school districts due to the Tax Levy Limit formula.
