Reports <u>Reports</u>

Scott Amo, Superintendent of Schools reported on the following:

- received information today from Tetra Teach that the EXCEL Project has received final approval. Bid documents will be made available by 4/1. There will be a prebid walkthrough on 4/7 with bid openings on 4/29.

- the high school initiated an action consistent with our Emergency Plan Guide this morning.

Proposition – Bus Purchases

To purchase (4) 65-passenger school buses to replace existing ten-year-old buses. The total cost not to exceed \$375,798, including trading in 4 buses, shall be raised by a tax on the taxable property of the School District to be collected in annual installments and to issue obligations in accordance with the Education Law and Local Finance Law. As part of the district's ongoing replacement plan, this purchase enables the district to obtain a potential State reimbursement rate of approximately 78.7%.

• <u>Budget Discussion</u>

DiscussionsThe Superintendent stated the special education projected savings by providing services in
the district versus purchasing services from BOCES is \$118,000, not \$76,980 that includes
benefits. The reason for the change is the reduction of 1.0 FTE teacher aide. The .4
psychologist position would not receive benefits. The psychologist would address
compliance issues and timeline issues.

The 1.0 FTE teacher would serve the students the district would otherwise purchase services from BOCES for at a cost of approximately \$30,000 per student.

The Superintendent stated a room has been identified and the district would have a projected savings each year.

Discussion ensued on classroom availability, utilization of buildings, and the possibility that, as students leave the program, the need to maintain the staff might be reduced.

Fund Balance

Discussion followed on the fund balance and the amount of money to use to apply to the proposed budget. Presently \$1.5 million is again tentatively planned to be applied. If the Board uses another \$600,000 from the fund balance, the tax rate would be the same as this year without any changes in assessed value.

Discussion followed on the amount of money in designated reserve accounts. The District could transfer fund balance monies into these designated reserve accounts, which will lower the undesignated reserve account.

The Superintendent and Business Manager will submit a recommendation for the next Board meeting on the fund balance.
