The Chairperson read the qualifications of voters:

- (1) A citizen of the United States
- (2) Shall be eighteen (18) or more years of age
- (3) A resident within the district for a period of 30 days next preceding the meeting at which he wishes to vote.
- (4) The Board of Education has upon its own motion provided for the personal registration of voters in the district. No person will be entitled to vote whose name does not appear on a School District Registration Card or who has not registered with the Clinton County Board of Registration to vote at general elections.

Proposition II – Bus Purchases

To purchase (4) 65-passenger school buses to replace existing ten-year-old buses. The total cost not to exceed **\$424,811.66**, including trading in 4 buses, shall be raised by a tax on the taxable property of the School District to be collected in annual installments and to issue obligations in accordance with the Education Law and Local Finance Law.

As part of the district's ongoing replacement plan, this purchase enables the district to obtain a potential State reimbursement rate of approximately 87.3%.

Proposition III- Board of Education Elections

To elect one (1) member to the Board of Education for 5-year terms (7/1/11 to 6/30/16) to fill the expired term of Leonard King.

The Chairperson asked for motion to submit Propositions I, II, and III for vote. A motion was made by Eleanore Inhelder, seconded by Sheila Bull and carried.

The Permanent Chairperson declared the polls open for voting at 11:00 a.m.

After determining that all eligible voters present had voted, the polls were declared closed at 8:02 pm by the Permanent Chairperson.
