

AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN BEEKMANTOWN CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT AND BEEKMANTOWN TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION

This agreement amends the July 1, 1978 - June 30, 1982 master agreement between the Beekmantown Central School District and the Beekmantown Teachers' Association. This agreement shall have full force and effect as of September 1, 1979. Except as amended or superseded by this agreement, the July 1, 1978 -June 30, 1982 agreement between the District and the Association remains in full force and effect. This agreement shall become effective upon ratification by the Board of Education, Beekmantown Central School District and the Beekmantown Teachers' Association.

1. Paragraph A of Article VII, Sick Leave, is hereby superseded by the following:

A teacher shall receive a maximum of fourteen (14) days of sick leave per year accumulative from year to year until a total of one hundred seventy-five (175) days has been accumulated. It is expressly understood that no teacher who has reached the maximum accumulation of one hundred seventy-five (175) days will be credited with additional days. Sick leave will be deducted from the maximum accumulation and additional days will be credited only to the extent to which one is eligible, i.e. fourteen (14) days, or to the extent necessary to return to maximum accumulation, whichever is applicable. For teachers who do not have accumulated sick leave, the teacher may borrow up to fourteen (14) days on anticipated accumulated sick leave at the discretion of the Superintendent of Schools. Notwithstanding the maximum accumulation as herein described, a teacher who has given notice of intention to retire as provided in Article VI of this agreement and who has been credited with the maximum accumulation at the beginning of the last year of service shall be credited with an additional five (5) days of sick leave. A teacher who uses any or all of these five (5) days shall continue to be eligible for the retirement benefit compensation based on the maximum accumulation of one hundred seventy-five (175) days. Any sick leave days used in excess of these five (5) days shall diminish proportionately the number of accumulated sick leave days to be used in computing the retirement benefit compensation.





geographic and a providence of the first of the second INTRODUCTION This policy and the procedures included with it are designed to meet the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), and the Beekmantown Central School District is committed to implement the policy and follow the procedures. The Board of Education authorizes the school superintendent to inform parents, students, and the public of the policy and to exercise his administrative resources to implement the policy as well as to deal with individuals who violate it. In case a parent of a student, an eligible student, or a citizen of the Beekmantown Central School District believes that the district is violating the FERPA, that person has a right to file a complaint with the Department of Health Education and Welfare. # DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this policy, the Beekmantown Central School District has used the following definitions of terms.

<u>Student</u> - any person who attends or has attended a program of instruction sponsored by the Board of Education of the Beekmantown Central School District.

Eligible student - a student or former student who has reached age 18 or is attending a postsecondary school.

<u>Parent</u> - either natural parent of a student unless his or her rights under the FERPA have been removed by a court order, a guardian, or an individual acting as a parent or guardian in the absence of the student's parent or guardian.

Education records - any record (in handwriting, print, tapes, film, or other medium) maintained by the Beekmantown Central School District, an employee of the district, or an agent of the district which is related to a student except:

- A personal record kept by a school staff member which meets the following tests:
  - a. It was made as a personal memory aid.
  - b. It is in the personal possession of the individual who made it.
  - c. Information contained in it has never been revealed or made available to any other person except the maker's temporary substitute.
- An employment record which is used only in relation to a student's employment by the Beekmantown Central School District. (Employment for this purpose does not include activities for which a student receives a grade or credit in a course.
- 3. Alumni records which relate to the student after he or she no longer attends classes provided by the Beekmantown Central School District and the records do not relate to the person as a student.

<u>Personal identifier</u> - is any data or information that makes the subject or a record known. This includes the student's name, the student's parent's or other family member's name, the student's address, the student's social security number, a student number, a list of personal characteristics, or any other information which would make the student's identity known.



### ANNUAL NOTIFICATION

Within the first three weeks of each school year, the Beekmantown Central School District will publish in the Plattsburgh Press Republican a notice to parents and eligible students of their rights under the FERPA and this policy. The district will also send home with each student a bulletin listing these rights and the bulletin will be included with a packet of material provided parents or an eligible student when the student enrolls during the school year.

The notice will include the following:

- 1. The right of a student's parents and eligible students to inspect and review the student's education records.
- 2. The intent of the Beekmantown Central School District to limit the disclosure of information contained in a student's education records except: (1) by the prior written consent of the student's parent or the eligible student, (2) as directory information, or, (3) under certain limited circumstances, as permitted by the FERPA.
- 3. The right of a student's parent or an eligible student to seek to correct parts of the student's education record which he or she believes to be inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of student rights. This right includes the right to a hearing to present evidence that the record should be changed if the district decides not to alter it according to the parent or eligible student's request.
- The right of any person to file a complaint with the Department of Education if the Beekmantown Central School District violates the FERPA.
- 5. The procedure that a student's parent or an eligible student should follow to obtain copies of this policy and the locations where copies may be obtained.

The district will arrange to provide translations of this notice to non-English speaking parents in their native language.

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# STATEMENT OF RIGHTS

Parents and eligible students have the following rights under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act and this policy.

- The right to inspect and review the student's education record.
- 2. The right to exercise a limited control over other people's access to the student's education record.
- The right to seek to correct the student's education record; in a hearing if necessary.
- The right to report violations of the FERPA to the Department of Education.
- 5. The right to be informed about FERPA rights.

All rights and protections given parents under the FERPA and this policy transfer to the student when he or she reaches age 18 or enrolls in a postsecondary school. The student then becomes an "eligible student."

### PROCEDURE TO INSPECT EDUCATION RECORDS

Parents of students and eligible students may inspect and review the student's education records upon request. In some circumstances, it may be mutually more convenient for the record custodian to provide copies of records. See the schedule of fees for copies on page 6.

Since a student's records may be maintained in several locations, the school principals will offer to collect copies of records or the records themselves from locations other than a student's school, so they may be inspected at one site. However, if parents and eligible students wish to inspect records where they are maintained, school principals will make every effort to accomodate their wishes.

Parents or eligible students should submit to the student's school principal a written request which identifies as precisely as possible the record or records he or she wishes to inspect.

The principal (or other custodian) will contact the parent of the student or the eligible student to discuss how access will be best arranged (copies, at the exact location, or records brought to a single site).

The principal (or other custodian) will make the needed arrangements as promptly as possible and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected. This procedure must be completed in 45 days or less from the receipt of the request for access.

If for any valid reason such as working hours, distance between record location sites, or health, a parent or eligible student cannot personally inspect and review a student's education record, the Beekmantown Central School District will arrange for the parent or eligible student to obtain copies of the record. See page 6 for information regarding fees for copies of records.

When a record contains information about students other than a parent's child or the eligible student, the parent or eligible student may not inspect and review the records of the other students.

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### FEES FOR COPIES OF RECORDS

The Beekmantown Central School District will not deny parents or eligible student any rights to copies of records because of the following published fees. Where the fee represents an unusual hardship, it may be waived in part or entirely by the record custodian. However, the district reserves the right to make a charge for copies such as transcripts it forwards to potential employers or to colleges and universities for employment or admissions purposes. The school district may deny copies of records (except for those required by the FERPA) in the following situations:

1. The student has an unpaid financial obligation to the school.

 There is an unresolved disciplinary action against the student which warrants the denial of copies.

The FERPA requires the school district to provide copies of records:

- When the refusal to provide copies effectively denies access to the records by a parent or eligible student.
- At the request of the parent or eligible student when the school district has provided the records to third parties by the prior consent of the parent or eligible student.
- At the request of the parent or eligible student when the school district has forwarded the records to another school where the student seeks or intends to enroll.

The fee for copies provided under the FERPA may not include the costs for search and retrieval. This fee will be from no cost to 25 cents per page.

The fee for all other copies such as copies of records forwarded to third parties with prior consent or those provided to parents as a convenience will be from 25 cents to 35 cents per page plus postage if that is involved.

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# DIRECTORY INFORMATION

The Beekmantown Central School District proposes to designate the following personally identifiable information contained in a student's education records as "directory information", and it will disclose that information without prior written consent.

- 1. The student's name
- 2. The names of the student's parents
- 3. The student's address
- 4. The student's date of birth
- 5. The student's class designation (i.e. 1st grade, 10th grade, etc.)
- 6. The student's extra curricular participation
- 7. The student's achievement awards or honors
- 8. The student's weight and height if a member of an athletic team
- 9. The student's photograph
- The school or school district the student attended before he or she enrolled in the Beekmantown Central School District

Within the first three weeks of each school year, the Beekmantown Central School District will publish in the Plattsburgh Press Republican the above list, or a revised list, of the items of directory information it proposes to designate as directory information. For students enrolling after the notice is published, the list will be given to the student's parent or the eligible student at the time and place of enrollment.

After the parents or eligible students have been notified, they will have two weeks to advise the school district in writing (a letter to the school superintendent's office) of any or all of the items they refuse to permit the district to designate as directory information about that student.

At the end of the two week period, each student's records will be appropriately marked by the records custodians to indicate the items the district will designate as directory information about that student. This designation will remain in effect until it is modified by the written direction of the student's parent or the eligible student.

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### USE OF STUDENT EDUCATION RECORDS

To carry out their responsibilities, school officials will have access to student education records for legitimate educational purposes. The Beekmantown Central School District will use the following criteria to determine who are school officials. An official is:

- 1. A person duly elected to the school board.
- 2. A person certified by the State and appointed by the school board to an administrative or supervisory position.
- 3. A person certified by the State and under contract to the school board as an instructor.
- 4. A person employed by the school board as a temporary substitute for administrative, supervisory, or instructional personnel for the period of his or her performance as a substitute.
- 5. A person employed by or under contract to the school board to perform a special task such as a secretary, clerk, the school board attorney or auditor for the period of his or her performance as an employee or contractor.

School officials who meet the criteria listed above will have access to a student's records if they have a legitimate educational interest in doing so. A "legitimate educational interest" is the person's need to know in order to:

- 1. Perform an administrative task required in the school employee's position description approved by the school board.
- 2. Perform a supervisory or instructional task directly related to the student's education.
- 3. Perform a service or benefit for the student or the student's family such as health care, counselling, student job placement, or student financial aid.

The Beekmantown Central School District will only release information from or permit access to a student's education records with a parent or cligible student's prior written consent except that the school superintendent or a person designated in writing by the superintendent may permit disclosure:

- When a student seeks or intends to enroll in another school district or a postsecondary school. The district will not further notify parents or eligible student prior to such a transfer of records. Parents and students have a right to obtain copies of records transferred under this provision.
- When certain Federal and State officials need information in order to audit or enforce legal conditions related to Federally supported education programs in the district.

- 3. To parties who provide or may provide financial aid to a student to:
  - a. Establish the student's eligibility for the aid.
  - b. Determine the amount of financial aid.
  - c. Establish the conditions for the receipt of the financial aid.
  - Enforce the agreement between the provider and the receiver of financial aid.
- If a State law adopted before November 19, 1974 required certain specific items of information to be disclosed in personally identifiable form from student records to State or local officials.
- 5. When the Beekmantown Central School District has entered into a written agreement or contract for an organization to conduct studies on the school district's behalf to develop tests, administer student aid, or improve instruction.
- 6. To accrediting organizations to carry out their accrediting functions.
- To parents of eligible students if the parents claim the student as a dependent as defined by the Internal Revenue Code of 1954.
- 8. To comply with a judicial order or lawfully issued subpoena. The district will make a reasonable effort to notify the student's parents or the eligible student before making a disclosure under this provision.
- 9. If the disclosure is an item of directory information and the student's parent or the eligible student has not refused to allow the district to designate that item as directory information for that student.

The Beekmantown Central School District will permit any of its officials to make the needed disclosure from sutdent education records in a health or safety emergency if:

- 1. He or she deems it is warranted by the seriousness of the threat to the health or safety of th student or other persons.
- 2. The information is necessary and needed to meet the emergency.
- The persons to whom the information is to be disclosed are qualified and in a position to deal with the emergency.
- Time is an important and limiting factor in dealing with the emergency.



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Beekmantown Central School District officials may release information from a student's education record if the student's parent or the eligible student gives his prior written consent for the disclosure. The written consent must include at least:

- 1. A specification of the records to be released.
- 2. The reasons for the disclosure.
- 3. The person or the organization or the class of persons or organizations to whom the disclosure is to be made.
- 4. The parent or student's signature.
- The date of the consent and, if appropriate, a date when the consent is to be terminated.

The student's parent or the sutdent may obtain a copy of any records disclosed under this provision.

The Beekmantown Central School District will not release information contained in a student's education records, except directory information, to any third parties except its own officials, unless those parties agree that the information will not be redisclosed without the parent or eligible student's prior written consent.

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RECORDS OF REQUESTS FOR ACCESS AND DISCLOSURES MADE FROM EDUCATION RECORDS

The Beekmantown Central School District will maintain an accurate record of all requests for it to disclose information from or to permit access to a student's education records and of information it discloses and access it permits with some exceptions listed below. This record will be kept with, but will not be a part of, each student's Cumulative School Records. It will be available only to the record custodian, the eligible student, the parent of the student, or to Federal, State, or local officials for the purpose of auditing or enforcing Federally supported educational programs.

The record will include at least:

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- 1. The name of the person or agency that made the request.
- 2. The interest the person or agency had in the information.
- 3. The date the person or agency made the request.
- Whether the request was granted and, if it was, the date access was permitted or the disclosure was made.

The district will maintain this record as long as it maintains the student's education record.

The record will not include requests or access or access granted to parents of the student or to an eligible student, requests for access or access granted to officials of the Beekmantown Central School District who have a legitimate educational interest in the student, requests for or disclosures of information contained in the student's education record if the request is accompanied by the prior written consent of a parent of the student or the eligible student or the disclosure is authorized by such prior consent, or for requests for, or disclosures of directory information designated for that student.

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#### PROCEDURES TO SEEK TO CORRECT EDUCATION RECORDS

Parents of students and eligible students have a right to seek to change any part of the student's record they believe is inaccurate, misleading or in violation of student rights.

For the purpose of outlining the procedure to seek to correct education records, the term "incorrect" will be used to describe a record that is inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of student rights. The term "correct" will be used to describe a record that is accurate, not misleading, and not in violation of student rights. Also, in this section, the term "requester" will be used to describe the parent of a student or the sligible student who is asking the school district to correct a record.

To establish an orderly process to review and correct an education record for a requester, the district may make a decision to comply with the request for change at several levels in the procedure.

<u>First level decision</u> - When a parent of a student or an eligible student finds an item in the student's education record which he or she believe is inaccurate, misleading or in violation of student rights, he or she should immediately ask the record custodian to correct it. If the record is incorrect because of an obvious error and it is a simple matter to make the record change at this level, the record custodian will make the correction. However, if the record is changed at this level, the method and result must satisfy the requester.

If the custodian cannot change the record to the requester's satisfaction or the record does not appear to be obviously incorrect, he will:

- 1. Provide the requester a copy of the questioned record at no cost,
- 2. Ask the requester to initiate a written request for the change, and
- 3. Follow the procedure for a second level decision.

<u>Second level decision</u> - The written request to correct a student's education record through the procedure at this level should specify the correction the requester wishes the district to make. It should at least identify the item the requester believes is incorrect and state whether he or she believes the item:

- 1. Is inaccurate and why,
- 2. Is misleading and why, or
- 3. Violates student rights and why.

The request will be dated and signed by the requester.

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Within two weeks after the record custodian receives a written request, he or she will: study the request, discuss it with other school officials (the person who made the record or those who may have a professional concern about the district's response to the request), make a decision to comply or decline to comply with the request, and complete the appropriate steps to notify the requester or move the request to the next level for a decision.

If, as a result of this review and discussion, the record custodian decides the record should be corrected, he will effect the change and notify the requester in writing that he has made the change. Each such notice will include an invitation for the requester to inspect and review the student's education record to make certain the record is in order and the correction is satisfactory.

If the custodian decides the record is correct, he will make a written summary of any discussions with other officials and of his findings in the matter. He will transmit this summary and a copy of the written request to the school superintendent.

<u>Third level decision</u> - The superintendent of schools will review the material provided by the record custodian and, if necessary discuss the matter with other officials such as the school attorney or the school board (in executive session). He will then make a decision concerning the request and complete the steps at this decision level. Ordinarily, this level of the procedure should be completed within two weeks. If it will take longer, the superintendent will notify the requester in writing of the reasons for the delay and a date when the decision will be made.

If the superintendent decides the record is incorrect and should be changed, he will advise the record custodian to make the changes. The record custodian will advise the requester of the change as he would if the change had been made at the second level.

If the superintendent decides the record is correct he will prepare a letter to the requester which will include:

- 1. The school district's decision, that the record is correct and the basis for the decision.
- 2. A notice to the requester that he or she has a right to ask for a hearing to present evidence that the record is incorrect and that the district will grant such a hearing.
- 3. Instructions for the requester to contact the superintendent, or an official he designates, to discuss acceptable hearing officers, convenient times, and a satisfactory site for the hearing.
- 4. Advice that the requester may be represented or assisted in the hearing by other parties, including an attorney at the requester's expense.

Fourth level decision - After the requester has submitted in writing his wishes concerning the hearing officer and the time and place for the hearing, the superintendent will, within a week, notify the requester when and where the district will hold the hearing and who it has designated as the hearing officer.

At the hearing, the hearing officer will provide the requester a full and reasonable opportunity to present material evidence and testimony to demonstrate that the questioned part of the student's education record is incorrect as shown in the requester's written request for a change in the record.

Within one week after the hearing, the hearing officer will submit to the superintendent of schools a written summary of the evidence submitted at the hearing. Along with the summary, the hearing officer will submit his or her recommendation, based solely on the evidence presented at the hearing, that the record should be changed or remain unchanged.

The superintendent of schools will prepare the district's decision within two weeks of the hearing. That decision will be based on the summary of the evidence presented at the hearing and the hearing officer's recommendation. However, the district's decision will be based solely on the evidence presented at the hearing. Therefore, the superintendent may over-rule the hearing officer if he believes the hearing officer's recommendation is not consistent with the evidence presented. As a result of the district's decision, the superintendent will take one of the following actions:

- If the decision is that the district will change the record, the superintendent will instruct the record custodian to correct the record. The record custodian will correct the record and notify the requester as at the second level decision.
- If the decision is that the district will not change the record, the superintendent will prepare a written notice to the requester which will include:
  - a. The school district's decision that the record is correct and will not be changed.
  - b. A copy of a summary of the evidence presented at the hearing and a written statement of the reasons for the district's decision.
  - c. Advice to the requester that he or she may place in the student's education record an explanatory statement which states the reasons he or she disagrees with the school district's decision and/or the reasons he or she believes the record is incorrect.

<u>Final administration step in the procedure</u> - When the Beekmantown Central School District receives an explanatory statement from a requester after a hearing, it will maintain that statement as part of the student's education record as long as it maintains the questioned part of the record. The statement will be attached to the questioned part of the record and whenever the questioned part of the record is disclosed, the explanatory statement will also be disclosed.

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ADOPTION

The Board of Education of the Beekmantown Central School District adopted this student records policy at its <u>June 16, 1981</u> meeting and thereby directs and authorized the appropriate school officials to establish and put in effect the procedures to implement the policy beginning immediately.

Copies of the policy will be available for parent and eligible student review in the principal's office of each school building and at the superintendent's office.
