The Board of Education is offering a total of four (4) personal days to compensate for additional contact time not specified in the contract to the aggrieved parties as specified by the Beekmantown Teachers

Association. The parties agree that the aggrieved parties are the current 2006-2007 school year teachers as listed for Beekmantown Elementary and Cumberland Head Elementary Schools--eighty-eight (88) teachers plus one (1) teacher-on-assignment for a total of eighty-nine (89) teachers. These four (4) personal days can be used over a three calendar year period commencing January 2, 2007. The use of these personal days will be contingent on the availability of substitutes and will be approved on a first come, first served basis. These four (4) personal days can be used before or after a holiday; shall be without reason or explanation; and only two of these days can be used consecutively per week. Anyone requesting personal days shall follow the procedure set forth in the collective bargaining agreement. Should the personal days not be utilized by the end of the three-year period any unused days will be carried over thereafter as sick leave accumulation. It is further agreed by and between the District and the Association that this proposal does not set forth any precedent in the interpretation or application of the collective bargaining agreement or any future negotiations by and between the District and the Association.

**B.** Resolved, that the Board of Education recognizes that the timeline for implementing the changes in the above resolution may need to be extended. The Board of Education authorizes the Board President to enter into discussion for additional time with the Beekmantown Teachers Association and administration as needed.
