The following procedures will be followed upon receipt of a referral to the  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{CPSE}}$ :

- The CPSE Chairperson will ensure that the parent immediately is sent a notice of referral, request for consent, an evaluation site list, a description of evaluations to be performed and due process rights.
- 2. If consent to evaluate is not received, the CPSE Chairperson will ensure that the parent is contacted by phone, in writing, or through a home visit to determine if the parent has received and understands the request for consent. All such attempts to contact the parent will be documented.
- Upon consent of the parent, the Board of Education will arrange for the program provider which the parent has selected to conduct an evaluation.
- 4. Within 30 days of obtaining parent consent, the CPSE will make a recommendation to the Board of Education. If the child is determined to be eligible, the CPSE may recommend for the board's approval programs and services identified in accordance with Section 200.16(i) of the Regulation of the Commissioner. The CPSE may recommend any program on the list approved by the State Education Department which is appropriate for the child. Prior to July 1, 1991, the board will be responsible for the provision of special education services to a preschool child only to the extent that there is an approved program available for such child.
- 5. If the child is receiving regular education services in a program approved or licensed by an appropriate governmental agency and the child requires an itinerant service, the CPSE may recommend such an itinerant related service from a list of providers maintained by the municipality.
- Within 30 days of the recommendation of the CPSE, the board must make a determination and arrange for the preschool child to receive services.
- Prior to July 1, 1991 the Board of Education will submit to its OECHC regional office a list of those preschool children for whom special education services are not available.
