ACCESS TO PUBLIC RECORDS

WHEREAS the Freedom of Information Law Section 88(2) and 88(4) is intended to develop an orderly process whereby the public may request access to records of government and simultaneously assure that agency personnel may be reasonably expected to react to those requests on a timely basis and in conformance with law.

NOw, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education of Beelmantown Central School District establishes the following policy relative to public access to records:

- 1. The "Records Ascess Officer" is designated as the Clerk of the Board.
- 2. The "Fiscal Officer" is designated as the School District Treasurer,
- 3. The Records of the Beekmantown Central School District are available for inspection or copy from 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. on any day that the district office has regular working hours.
- 4. The Clerk of the Board will make copies of records on request at a cost of 25¢ per page or fraction thereof.
- 5. There shall be no charge for a certification that a record cannot be found, or certification as to the correctness of a record, or for the public inspection of a record where no copy is requested.
- 6. Forms for filing a request for record inspection shall be on file at the office of the Clerk of the Board.
 - 7. All requests for records shall be in writing.

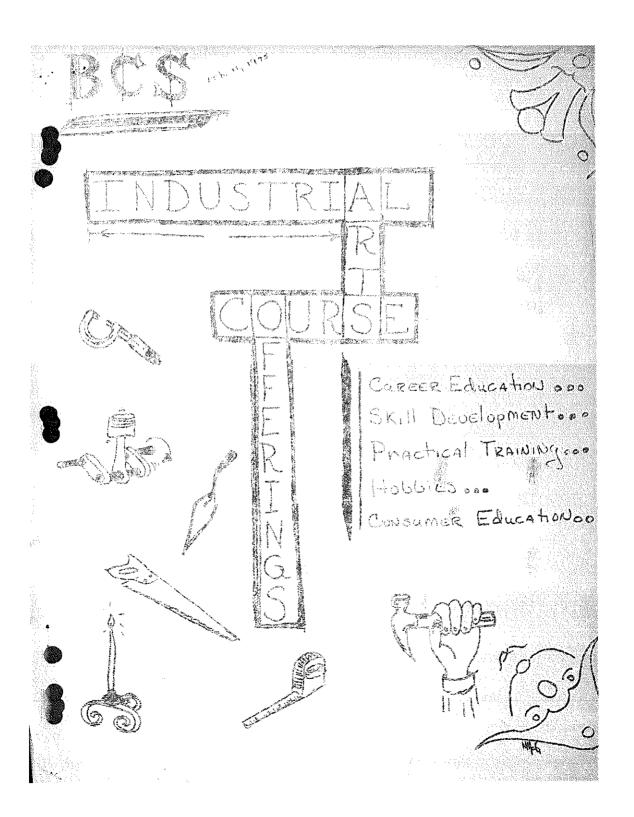

FROM: David Beobie, Science Department Chairman

RE: Hobile Science Laboratory

A field trip which provides a "firsthand" learning experience is an especially valuable teaching resource, particularly to the science teacher when the entire out of doors becomes a potential laboratory. The North Country exhibits some unique and remarkable natural assets which are used by teachers to illustrate topics discussed in the classroom or as areas for studente to collect specimens and data which is them taken back to the classroom for study. There is very little epportunity, however, for the students to study and examine the material he collects while in the field. We therefore fail to capitalize on the enthasiasm and interest of the moment and the relatedness of the material to its natural environment. Examining a sample of water for microargenisms is much more exciting if done while on the shore of lake Champiain than when done the next day in a completely different environment.

It is with these thoughts in mind that the following proposal is submitted for your consideration:

> "THAT ONE (1) SIXTY-PASSENGER SCHOOL BUS, DUE TO BE RETIRED FROM OUR FLEET, BE RETAINED FOR LIMITED USE AS A MOBILE SCIENCE LABORATORY."

The bus may be conversed to a useful lab by removing the entire row of seats from the driver's side and installing a work counter along the windows. The counter top would be approximately 18" wide, 36" high and 20' long and attached to base cabinets below. The base cabinets, while providing storage during transport of students, will be secured to the bus floor. The 36" high work surface will allow students to work confortably while standing. The remaining 10 seats along the right side of the bus will accommodate 20-30 students while in transit. It is understood that all remodeling plane will be consistent with Department of Transportation safety regulations and only with its approval.

To make this proposal more fessible, as well as to allow for more flexibility in planning and implementing field experiences in the future, Mr. John Messey, Mr. John Pelkay and Mr. Beebic are interested in obtaining the training necessary to enable them to drive their own classes in the Mobile Lab.

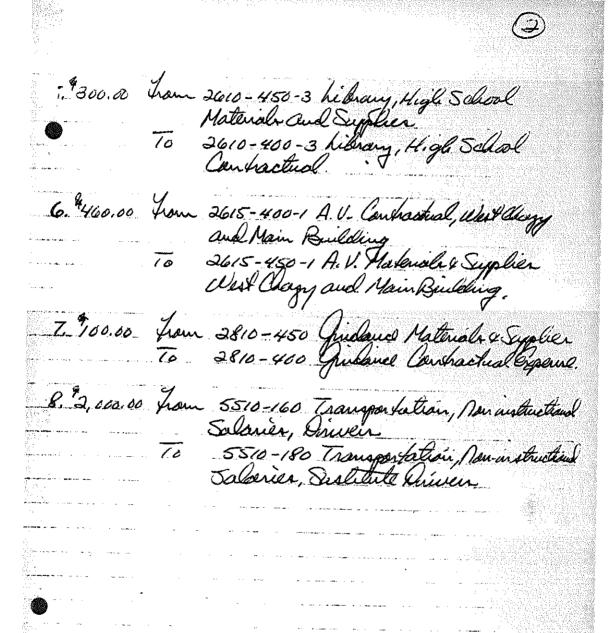

SUBJECT: Bid Awards - Trash Removal, Staff Vehicle and #2 Fuel Oil

Bids were opened at 2:00 P.M. on May 13, 1975 for the furnishing of the following items:

1. #2 Fuel Oil - bids were received from A. Fortin Sons - \$.359 per gallon and Metropolitan Petroleum Co. - \$.3640 per gallon. Recommendation: The Board of Education should accept the low bid of \$.359 per gallon (upward and downward escalating clause with market trend) as submitted by A. Fortin Sons of Plattsburgh for the delivery of #2 fuel oil during the 1975-76 school year.

- 2. Staff Vehicle bids were received from Goss Dodge \$4,242.00, Oswald Ford \$4,095.00 and McBride Chevrolet \$3,955.02. Recommendation: The Board of Education should accept the low bid of \$3,955.02 as submitted by McBride Chevrolet of Plattsburgh. The bid is in compliance with specifications.
- 3. Trash Removal bids were received from Northern Sanitation and Trudeau's Trucking as follows:
 - A. Northern Sanitation Contractor will supply dumpsters - \$2,884.00 Contractor will not supply dumpsters - \$2,999.50
 - B. Trudeau's Trucking Contractor will supply dumpsters - \$1,720.00 Contractor will not supply dumpsters - \$1,920.00

Northern Sanitation also submitted an alternate proposal of \$1,680.00 with dumpsters, but further stipulated that the pickup time must be between the hours of 9 A.M. - 11 A.M. each day.

Recommendation: The Board of Education should accept the low bid of \$1,720.00 with dumpsters as submitted by Trudeau's Trucking for trash removal during the 1975-76 school year. Trudeau's low bid allows the school district to designate the pickup time as cafeteria operations dictate.

Letter To Parent - Lunch And Special Milk

Dear Parent or Guardians

The Beekmantown Central School serves good lunches and milk every full school day. These lunches and milk will help keep your child healthy. Students may buy a lunch for 50 cents, and milk for 10 cents.

Some families find it impossible to pay for their children's lunch and special milk. If you cannot afford to pay the full price, or if you think your child should have a free lunch and a free special milk, fill out the attached application form. First look at the income scale (Attachment No. 2) which shows how much money you can earn and still get a free lunch and free special milk or a reduced price lunch for 10 cents. If you make more money than the income scale shows, but you have had to pay for special hardships (See Attachment No. 2), you are possibly eligible for a free or reduced price lunch and a free special milk. (See Attachment No. 2). If assistance is needed in completing the application, please contact School Nurse Teacher.

Your child will be treated the same as other children and no one will know who is paying and who is not.

In the operation of child feeding programs, no child shall be discriminated against because of his race, sex, color, or national origin.

If you think that you are eligible for free or reduced price lunches and a free special milk for your children, fill out the application and return it to the school office. Within 10 (ten) days after receipt of your application, the school will let you know if your children are to receive a free or reduced price lunch and a free special milk. If you do not agree with the school's decision, you have the right to a fair hearing. This can be done by calling or writing Superintendent of Schools at P.O. Box 829, Plattsburgh. A copy of the hearing precedure is available for you to read at Business Office Beekmantown Central School District, Beekmantown Corners, P.O. Nox 829, Plattsburgh, New York 12901.

If your income changes during the school year, please contact School Nurse Teacher. You may apply for free and/or reduced price lunches and free special milk for your children any time during the school year.

"Family" means a group of related or non-related individuals, who are not residents of an institution or boarding school, but who are living as one economic unit. This includes son, daughter, relatives, etc.

"Income" means all sources of earned or unearned monies before deductions for income taxes, insurance premiums, bonds, alimony, child support, etc. which would be available to the "family" to pay the price of a child's meal.

"Hardship deduction" -"Family income" can be reduced by the value of the following expenses which you may have had to pay: Medical expense payments above \$30.00 per family member per year; Shelter costs above 30% of your "Income"; Education expenses due to a child's physical or mental condition; and Disaster or Casualty losses. (See reverse for interpretation)

"Foster Children" - A foster child placed in a private residence, where adoption is not involved, would be eligible under the criteria for a family of one, if the income for that child does not exceed the applicable Family Income Scale. This provision is in effect regardless of the gross income of the foster parent.

Guidelines for Interpreting Special Hardship Conditions

"Income" can be adjusted for the following special hardship conditions which could not be reasonably anticipated or controlled by the household:

- (I) UNUSUALLY HIGH MEDICAL EXPENSES: Total actual payments above \$30.00 per year per family member, made by the household for physician or dentist services, hospitalization, prescription drugs, prescribed medical and dental services, transportation to and/or from sources of medical or dental treatment, nursing care in or out of the home, payments for Medicare and/or health insurance. Special diets are not an allowable deduction. Full or partial payments made by outside agencies such as welfare, Medicare or insurance companies are not part of the household costs and should not be included as part of the deduction when adjusting the "income".
- (II) SHELTER COSTS IN EXCESS OF 30 PERCENT OF INCOME: Shelter costs include rent and utilities such as heating, cooking fuel, electricity, water and sewage disposal fees. In the case of a household which is buying or owns its own home, shelter costs would include mortgage payments which includes principal; interest on mortgage principal; real estate taxes; school taxes; water taxes; sewer taxes and special assessments required by State or local law. When the shelter costs exceed 30 percent of the household "income", only that amount in excess of the 30 percent can be deducted from the "income" as an adjustment.
- (III) SPECIAL EDUCATION EXPENSES DUE TO THE MENTAL OR PHYSICAL CONDITION OF A CHILD: Total payments made for tuition and/or mandatory fees by the family to a school or institution in meeting the educational needs of a child can be deducted from "income".
- (IV) DISASTER OR CASUALTY LOSSES: Unusual expenses incurred due to an individual household disaster, or casualty losses which could not be reasonably anticipated, can be deducted from "income". This can be uninsured costs of fire, flood, theft or death which directly affects the family "income" through an expenditure of funds.
