in order to determine whether or not the Beekmantown School District is eligible for and may receive the funds required for the construction of the new teaching facility, it is required that the qualified voters of the Beekmantown School District assent to the purchase of such lands and the construction of the facility as specified in the Education Laws of the State of New York, NOWTHEREFORE BE IT

that in the event such authorization is approved by the qualified voters of Beekmantown School District, and that the application for the public monies designated by the Public Works Employment Act of 1976 be further processed with any acquisition of land and subsequent construction of the new teaching facility and be contingent upon the approval of the application for such public monies designated by the Public Works Employment Act to the extent of \$1,550,000 and that the Board of Education be authorized to issue obligations of the district in an amount not to exceed \$160,000 and to levy a tax to be collected in installments for payment of principal and interest in the obligation of \$160,000 pursuant to the provisions of the Education Law and the Local Finance law of the State of New York.

AND FURTHER RESOLVED:

that the following resolution be submitted to the voters of the school district: "Shall the Board of Education be authorized to expend the sum of \$30,000 for the acquisition of 64 acres of land, more or less, from Viola Luck situated on the westerly side of New York State Route 22 at Beekmantown Corners, Town of Beekmantown, Clinton County, State of New York, and to construct a new teaching facility thereon not to exceed the cost of \$4,680,000 for the use of site development, professional fees, building cost, and furnishings and equipment provided, however, that the application of the Board of Education for public funds under the provisions of the Public Works Employment Act of 1976 be approved to the extent of \$4,550,000 and that the Board of Education be authorized to issue obligations of the district in an amount not to exceed \$160,000 and to levy a tax to be collected in installments for payment of principal and interest on said obligations of not more than \$160,000 pursuant to the provisions of the Education Law and the local Finance Law of the State of New York."

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

CLINTON COUNTY SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I -NAME

This Association shall be known as the Clinton County School Boards Association.

ARTICLE II -OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this Association shall be as follows:

- 1. To promote and encourage cooperation between the various school boards in the interest of better education.
- To provide a forum for exchange of information on school problems.
- 3.To hold conferences for the discussion of school problems.
- 4. To provide a nermanent organization which will voice the wishes of its members on legislation or other matters.
- To assist its members in every possible way with their school board problems.
- 6. To further the mutual objectives of this Association and the New York State School Boards Association.

ARTICLE III -MEMBERSHIP

Upon notifying the Secretary-Treasurer in writing of its intention to become a member and by paying the annual fees as provided, any Board of Education in Clinton County is eligible for membership in this Association including any district extending into Clinton County.

Each member board is entitled to one vote.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

The regularly <u>elected</u> officers of this Association shall consist of a President and Secretary-Treasurer.

These officers shall be nominated and elected as hereinafter provided. (See Article VI). Their duties shall be the usual duties of such officers.

The term of office of the elected officers shall be from July 1, to June 30. One member of any active member board or district shall be eligible for elective office. The anexpired term of any elected officer may be filled by appointment by the Executive Committee until the next annual meeting.

ARTICLE V -EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

There shall be an executive committee of nine members consisting of the President, Secretary-Treasurer, and a representative selected by each of the remaining school districts prior to the annual meeting of the Association.

The general responsibility of conducting the affairs of the Association shall be verted in this committee. It shall be regularly convened quarterly and at any other time subject to the call of the President. The President shall act as Chairman of the Executive Committee or, in his absence. The Sceretary-Treasurer.

A majority vote of the Executive Committee shall be required for the passage of any resolution except establishment of fees (see Art.1X).

The term of office shall be two years except that the first itera shall be one year for Beekmantown, Chazy, Northern Adirondack, Peru, Saranac, and two years thereafter.

ARTICLE VI- NOMINATING CONTITUE

The President shall appoint a Nominating Committee which shall report to a regularly called meeting of the Executive Committee its recommendations for President and Scoretary-Treasurer. The Scoretary-Treasurer shall mail a copy of the report as adopted by the Executive Committee to all members of the Association together with the call for the annual meeting. Further nominations of officers may be made from the floor at the annual meeting. Only one trustee or member of any active member board or district shall be eligible for elective office. (See Article IV - Officers).

ARTICLE VII - MEETINGS

The <u>Annual Meeting</u> of the Association shall be held during the last quarter of each <u>fiscal</u> year.

The time and place of this meeting shall be determined by the Executive Committee. Officers and Executive Committee members shall be elected at this meeting.

Special meetings may be called by the Executive Committee for the transaction of business other than election or officers and members of the Executive Committee.

Notices of annual or special meetings shall be mailed to reach the membership of the Association at least thirty (30) days before the date of such recting.

ARTICLE VIII- COMETITIES

The President, each year, may appoint the following committees:

- 1. Program
- 3. Auditing
- 2. Legislation
- 4. kemini ing (see Article VI)

The President shall also appoint such other committees as may be determined by the Executive Committee.

The Γ equative Committee, as a whole, small serve as the Budget Committee.

ARTICLE IX -SERVICE FEE

The annual service (ee shall be \$100/yr./Board of Education; and shall be established annually by the Executive Committee. A two-third (2/3) vote of the Executive Committee shall be required for establishing the fee.

Bills shall be mailed during the first quarter of the fiscal year. Schools with service fees unpaid will not be elegible to your at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE X -FISCAL POLICY

The fiscal year shall be from July 1 through June 30.

The Secretary/Treasurer shall receive all fees and deposit same to the account of the Association.

Disbursements shall be paid by the Secretary-Treasurer.

All accounts shall be audited by the Auditing Committee annually at a time designated by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this Constitution and By-Laws may be adopted by a majority vote of active members present and voting at any annual meeting upon the proposal of such change by the Executive Committee providing at least 20 days notice of the proposed amendments shall have been mailed to members.

Board Policy

The following Board policies are requested to help bring the District into compliance with Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972.

- It is the policy of the Beekmantown Central School District not to discriminate on the basis of sex in any of its educational programs, activities, or employment policies.
- 2. It is the policy of the Beekmantown Central School District not to provide any course, program, or activity separately on the basis of sex or require or refuse participation in any of these by any of its students on such basis.
- 3. It is the policy of the Beekmantown Central School District not to provide physical education classes separately on the basis of sex but to divide integrated classes only for instruction in contact sports.
- 4. It is the policy of the Beekmantown Central School District not to provide any vocational program or course separately on the basis of sex or require or refuse participation in any of these by any of its students on such basis.
- 5. It is the policy of the Reekmantown Central School District not to discriminate against any person on the basis of sex in counseling or guidance of students.
- 6. It is the policy of the Beekmantown Central School District not to use any counseling, testing, or appraisal materials which permit or require different treatment of students on the basis of sex.
- 7. It is the volicy of the Beekmantown Central School District not to exclude any student from participation in or deny any student the benefits of any academic, extracurricular, occupational, or other educational program on the basis of sex. In addition, the Beekmantown Central School District will not consider participation in or cooperation with any outside agency which does so.
- P. It is the policy of the Beekmantown Central School District not to develop or apply any rule concerning a student's actual or potential parental, family, or marital status which treats students differently on the basis of sex.
- 9. It is the policy of the Beekmantown Central School District not to discriminate in any manner against any student on the basis of such student's pregnancy, childbirth, false pregnancy, termination of pregnancy or recovery therefrom, unless the student requests voluntarily to participate separately in a program or activity.

10. It is the policy of the Beekmantown Central School District not to discriminate on the basis of sex in any interscholastic or intramural athletics offered by the school.

RECOMMENDATION FOR SCHOOL HOURS FOR THE 1977-78 SCHOOL YEAR

SHIPMARY OF BACKGROUND

On April 4, 1977 a memorandum was sent to you outlining possibilities for conducting "overlap sessions" in our secondary schools during the 1977-78 school year. The memorandum was the result of much study and discussion. A number of assumptions and implications of two possibilities (distributing sixth grades sensin in the main building) were sited.

Mithout discussing inmifications in detail. I would point out a few bajor considerations in recommending in everlap session. It might also be stated that we could continue to hold clauses on this year's schedule, but it appears that most people directly affected by the inconvenience of the present bours would prefer other inconveniences in order to improve times of attendance.

(Werlapping will curtail the use of some spaces at least during the time of overlap. For example, the secondary school library will have to be used by grades 7-12 at the same time. Also, the cafeteria will be unavailable for elementary school use for casing although masts will be dispensed from there.

Homerbooks for grades seven and eight will have to be held in the equitorium.

There might need to be some additional transportation.

The departmentalization of the sixth grade can be continued and uniformity of approach is more nearly attainable when the whole grade is under one authority.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended by the Superintendent and the administrative staff that hours for elementary schools be set at approximately the same times as this present year, that the sixth grades be in attendance during those hours and be housed at the Main Building, and that the secondary school grades be in attendance from about 7:15 A.M. to about 12:65 P.M. for 9-12 and from about 10:15 A.M. to about 4:00 P.M. for grades 7-2. Further, it is recommended that hunch periods be held for grades 1-8 during their normal school day.
